Beware of Carbon Monoxide in the Home

The weather is getting cooler and soon, we will be turning on our heating systems in our homes. [We need to beware of a possible carbon monoxide leak and how to identify it. Carbon Monoxide \(CO\) is a colorless, odorless, gas-a byproduct of combustion that results whenever any fuel such as gas, oil, kerosene, wood, or charcoal is burned.](#) CO is a poison that, when inhaled, bonds with the hemoglobin in your blood displacing oxygen. Our appliances that burn fuel, such as furnaces, some clothes dryers, ranges, oven, water heaters, or space heaters, must be maintained and used properly. If they are not working properly or are used incorrectly, dangerous levels of CO can result.

Most home have a CO detector and it is always a wise investment. Some are hard wired into the electrical system of your home, but they also offer battery operated ones, like smoke detectors.


Prevention is truly the key to keeping your family safe. To minimize the potential of CO poisoning:

- Know the early signs and symptoms of CO poisoning.
- Make sure appliances are installed by a certified professional according to manufacturer's instructions and local building codes.
- Install a UL approved CO detector in each sleeping area of the home, making sure the detector is not obstructed by furniture or draperies.
- Never use portable fuel-burning camping equipment inside your home.
- Never leave a car running in an attached garage, even with the garage door open.
- Have fuel-burning appliances serviced by professionals and always refer to the owner's manual when performing minor adjustments
- Never use gas appliances such as ranges, ovens, or clothes dryers for heating your home.
- Never operate non-vented fuel-burning appliances in any room with closed doors or windows,
- Do not use gasoline-powered tools and engines indoors
