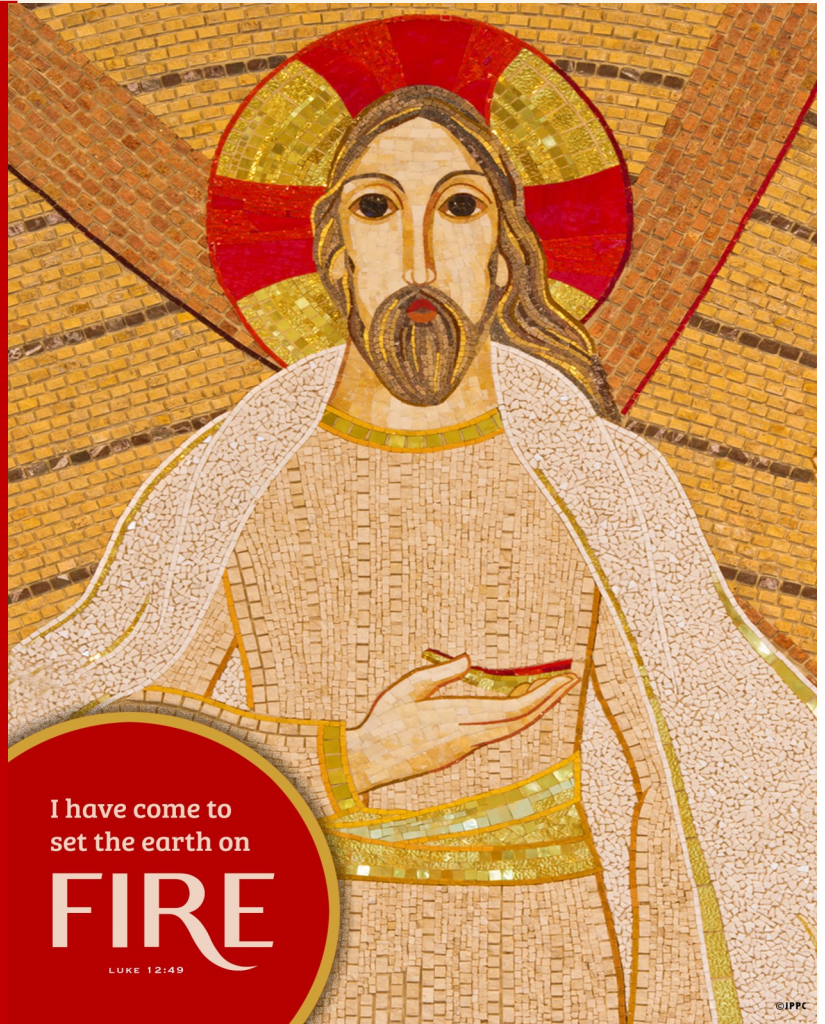

Sunday August 14 Readings

Reading I: Jeremiah 38: 4-6, 8-10

The prophet suffers for his preaching, to the point where he is tossed into a muddy cistern. An Ethiopian court official named Ebed-Melech saves him from certain death.

Reading II: Hebrews 12: 1-4

We should never abandon the struggle it is to "run the race." Jesus is our model for this perseverance. He endured the cross "for the sake of the joy that lay before Him."

The Gospel: Luke 12: 49-53

John the Baptist had preached about "Someone coming who would baptize with the Holy Spirit and fire" In this passage "fire" is meant as the power of Jesus' preaching to clear error away. Also, "baptism" here is not meant the sacrament, but some overwhelming catastrophe." Such realities will inevitably bring about division even among families.

FAITH FORMATION NEWS:

August days are passing by quickly, but Elaine and I have been planning for the new Faith Formation year all summer long. We are excited to share with you some of our big news!

Family Mass is coming back! Beginning on September 18th at the 10 AM Mass (also the first day of our new Faith Formation School Year), and then approximately every other week, this Mass will be adapted for our children and their families. Liturgy of the Word for Children will be a part of these Family Masses, with the children gathering near the altar, instead of leaving for a classroom. Our Children's Choir and lots of new music will be a regular part of these Masses, and we will be having our young people help as lectors and cantors as well.

For those families choosing Home Instruction for their children's Faith Formation classes this year, attendance at two Whole Family Catechesis Workshops, full of guest speakers and fun social activities, will be an addition to that program. Our in-seat classes will continue to have regular visits from our priests, in the church and in their classrooms.

Starting this Fall, we are organizing some Adult Faith Formation opportunities, geared towards parents of our program's children, and led by catechists/parents. Look for more information on this initiative in a few weeks! We will continue our very successful OLBS Community Service projects for all our students and families, grades K-8, beginning in September and going until May. Check the bulletin and Faith Formation emails for our opening projects soon!
