When our son first entered high school, he continued to have music classes scheduled, continuing from previous years; however, when he was approaching junior year, with ambitions to attend the Naval Academy, he had to concentrate on STEM courses and forego his music selections. With his father and I both being trained and professional musicians, as well as teachers, this was a little sad to hear at first, but we both realized our son was taking the reins we had lovingly held, steered and guided when he was little and setting off on his own path. Now that he is 25, our son still sings and plays, but just for fun and relaxation, and his career right now as a Nuclear Officer in the Navy is certainly his own well-defined “flight”, as St. Mother Theresa says. My husband used to say when Dylan was born, we hitched his wagon to ours, but as he grew older, it was ours who followed his: always there if he needed us, always there to love and reassure. And so it should be with all our children! We lay the groundwork as parents and guardians: we teach, we support, we model, we mentor, but, in the end, it is and should be our children who carry all that we passed on to them and forge their own way. Our Father in heaven has always been and will always be there for us in much the same way as we are and should be to our children. St. Mother Theresa’s words are a beautiful reminder of how precious and everlasting the love of a parent is for their child as is the awesome precious, perfect and everlasting love our Father has for us.
