MUSIC MINISTRY MINUTES

If you ever find yourself on Jeopardy someday, and you choose “Biblical References” for 800, and the answer is “Exodus 15”, this week’s Minutes can help you with the question!

The first mention of singing in the Old Testament is found in Exodus, chapter 15. Moses has led the Hebrew slaves to the Red Sea, with Pharaoh and his army close behind. God tells Moses to stretch his hand and his staff out over the sea. The Red Sea parts and the Israelites, with walls of water on either side, race on what is now dry land to the other side, still followed in pursuit by the Egyptians. When all led by Moses were safely across, God speaks to Moses again, asking him to stretch out his hand, so the waters of the Red Sea flow back, and cover the chariots and charioteers of Pharaoh’s army. Realizing the mighty power of God had been shown to them, Moses and the Israelites begin to sing the first recorded song in the Bible and the word “sing” makes an important appearance.

Though the “lyrics” of the first song are found in Exodus 15, we do not have any way of knowing what tune they sang, no musical manuscripts exist of what must have been quite a song. Still, Moses and his followers, having escaped the wrath of Egypt and having seen the mighty power of God, I imagine the music of the first song was joyful, grateful, reverent and incredibly moving; how could it be otherwise? On Easter Vigil, we will listen to the Exodus 15 reading and we will sing the responsorial psalm, which uses the words from Moses’ first song. “I will sing to the Lord, for He is gloriously triumphant!”

Now, back to Jeopardy. The question is, “Where does the first song in the bible appear?” Well, now you know, Exodus 15, so congratulations, you are correct! Don Pennell
